Four Three Rivers Counties Declare States of Emergency for COVID-19 Response

Three Rivers District Health Department — On March 14, 2020, Carroll, Gallatin, Owen and Pendleton counties declared states of emergency to further prepare and respond to COVID-19.


“We are in full support of the decision of our elected officials to declare states of emergency. Declaring states of emergency opens our area to additional resources to support efforts to prepare for and respond to COVID-19 in our region,” stated Three Rivers Director, Georgia Heise DrPH.

Currently, there are no cases of COVID-19 in our district, but the situation is rapidly evolving. Three Rivers continues to work with partners to prepare and plan for the spread of COVID-19 in the community. This includes education and guidance to the general public, health care providers and other sectors, including schools, first responders, social service agencies, homeless shelters and organizations that serve those at high risk of becoming very sick from COVID-19.
